Wheat bids moved higher for second consecutive day in reaction to continued fund buying and positive export outlook for wheat.

Corn and soybean bids moved slightly higher from spillover support from wheat pits and recent improvement in export bean, meal and corn demand. Wheat 2 to 6 cents higher. Corn 1 to 3 cents higher. Sorghum 2 to 4 cents higher. Soybeans 2 to 4 cents higher. Carryover strength from Tuesday's active fund buying in wheat pits offered additional support to wheat bids. Dry, dry weather conditions in winter wheat growing areas continued to concern traders. The possibility for export demand to improve with Russia showing up on the books as well as Egypt and Turkey, forced wheat bids to climb higher. Corn and bean bids were stronger again today, pulled upward by stronger wheat trade. Morocco's generous purchase of corn was positive to bids. Soybean meal has kept bean bids stronger with export sales giving beans an upward push. Dry weather remains in parts of Brazil and about 50,000 tonnes of South American soymeal was reported to be sold to China. Light fund buying was a boosting factor in beans.
