

## Maryland Holstein **Scholarships**

DICKERSON, Md. - Seven scholarships are to be available to qualifying Maryland residents through the sponsorship of the Maryland Holstein Association.

According to a recent news release, the Maryland Holstien Association Scholarship Committee has announced that six \$500 scholarships and one \$2,000 scholarship are to be awarded to resident agricultural college students.

Of the \$500 scholarships:

• Two are to be available to students of the University of Maryland College of Agriculture;

• Two are to be available to students enrolled in the two-year program of the University of Maryland Institute of Applied Agriculture, or a similar program at another college;

• Two are to be available to resident students enrolled in agriculture at the college of their choice.

Out of the winners of the six scholarships, one person is to be selected to receive a \$2,000 Frank D. Brown Jr. Memorial Scholarship, made to the most outstanding scholarship applicant.

Applicants must be Maryland residents who have had registered Holsteins as 4-H or FFA projects and must be currently enrolled in

an agriculture program. All applications will be considered and the winners notified.

Progressive Breeder Award status was achieved by Erica Davis, Gregory Davis, and Jason Troutman. Jesse Bitler was named distinguished junior member.


Executive director of the Pennsylvania Holstein Association, Bill Nichols, reported on export activities of the Association.
