Bone-in breasts increased in overall availability; however, buyers were less aggressive and often took a wait and see position. Boneless skinless breasts were adequate and in generally good balance. Leg quarters were fully adequate to occasionally ample. Drumsticks were ample. Wings were in uneven distribution, but at least adequate.

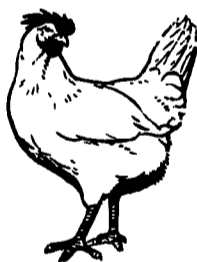

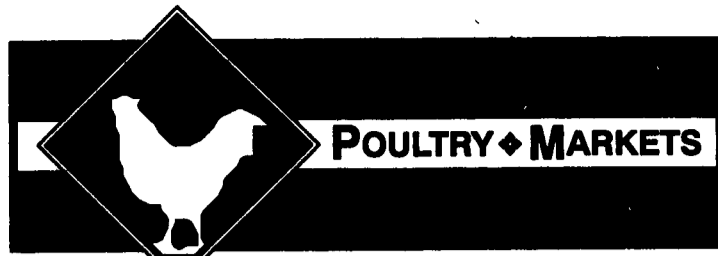
NY Phil Frozen Eggs

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was slowing. Offerings were at least adequate. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were in a full range and were generally desirable. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 63 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, breast items were adequate to closely cleared. Other items, particularly drums and occasionally leg quarters were at least adequate for the selective buying interest.
