MARKET COMMENT: PRICES TO RETAILERS IN PHILADELPHIA WERE UNCHANGED TO LOWER, AND THE BALANCE OF PRICES WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS BARELY STEADY TO WEAK FOR WHITE EGGS, AND CAUTIOUSLY STEADY FOR BROWN EGGS. DEMAND REMAINED SEASONALLY GOOD. SUPPLIES OF WHITE EGGS WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE AND AVAILABLE, AND BROWN EGG SUPPLIES WERE NO MORE THAN ADEQUATE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE TO FULLY ADEQUATE FOR THE LIGHT DEMAND. Prices were unchanged to lower for white eggs in the Northeast and Midwest, and the balance of prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady at best for white eggs with a cautious tone mounting. Demand was moderate to excellent into retail channels, and institutional movement was mixed across the full range. Supplies of brown eggs were no more than adequate, and white egg supplies were adequate to fully adequate or available. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate for the light demand, and prices were lower under a barely steady to weak trade sentiment. Spent hen offerings were adequate to fully adequate for the light to moderate

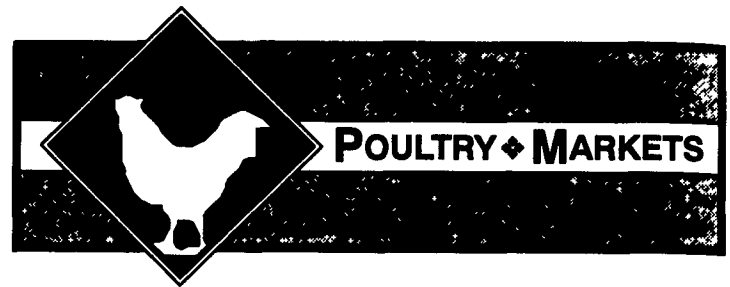

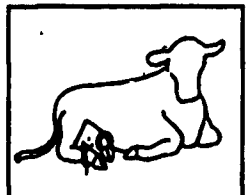
