Supplies were generally adequate or available with occasional shortages of graded eggs, mediums, and all brown sizes. Breaking stock supplies were at least adequate for the light to moderate demand, and prices were unchanged to lower under a steady trade sentiment. Spent hen offerings continued at least adequate for the light to moderate demand, and plants ran mixed schedules from full to part-time.


