Bill joined the PSU Dairy and Animal Science staff in 1981 after a 10-year career in teaching and research at Virginia Tech (VPI). Since that time he has been a fulltime extension specialist in the Department of Dairy and Animal Science.

Bill is a native of Chester County, Pennsylvania and graduated from Penn State with a degree in Dairy Science in 1964. He continued his education with an M.S. degree in Animal Science from The University of New Hampshire in 1966 and obtained his Ph.D. degree also in Animal Science from Virginia Tech in 1969. He stayed on at Virginia Tech for more than a decade and was an Associate Professor at the time he moved to · Penn State.

Bill has been involved in many projects with many people during his 14 years in the Dairy and Animal Science Department. He first worked with the DHIA program where he conducted educational programs in the areas of dairy records, dairy management and udder health. He also served as interim general manager of PaDHIA in 1984 and 1985. One of his major accomplishments was to encourage DHIA to purchase equipment that would measure somatic cell counts (SCC) in the milk of tested cows. When such information became available on a large number of cows he designed the procedures that summarized the data and reported it back to the individual herd where it could be used to monitor mammary health.

Dr. Heald recently developed a computerized mastitis knowledge base for use in the first Mastitis Expert System to be used in this country. He has been involved in many areas of interest to the dairy

industry. One of the most recent is the Dairy Map program which he adapted for use in Pennsylvania after observing the Pro-Dairy project developed at Cornell for New York state dairy producers.

Now in its fourth year in Pennsylvania, Dairy Map has attracted widespread attention both in-state and out. He has also organized a professional dairy managers group and offered strong encouragement to Pennsylvania dairy leadership to form the Pennsylvania Dairy Industry Future Committee with the vision to develop a strategy that will enhance the future of the state's dairy industry. Bill has also served as an interim head of the Dairy and Animal Science department and recently completed a three-year stint as coordinator of the departments extension specialist group. His efforts have brought him in contact with dairymen, county extension personnel and agricultural leaders from the state and the nation.

Bill has had numerous commit-

tee assignments at the departmental and college level at Penn State and he has been an active participant in national meetings of his professional societies. He completed a sabbatic leave at Cornell University in 1988 while improving computer skills that would assist in developing dairy management decision making programs. He is currently on leave at the University of Minnesota working with computers in the area of technology transfer and use of case studies as tools for educational programming.

Bill is a member of the American Dairy Science Association, the American Society of Animal Science, Dairy Shrine, Penn State Dairymen's Club and several honor societies. Bill and wife Judy live in Spring Mills, and are the parents of two children, Beth and
