fund selling on the board Traders will have to wait until next Tuesday for USDA's Crop Production and Grain Stocks report due to blizzard conditions in Washington. Wheat mixed. Com 3 to 6 cents lower. Sorghum 6 to 10 cents lower. Soybeans 2 to 6 cents lower. Indications that China had bought 750,000 tonnes of US wheat Tuesday and that Morocco was seeking a large quantity of optional origin wheat offered some strength to wheat bids.
