Oklahoma City Feeder Cattle

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK
 JANUARY 10, 1996

Compared to last test three weeks ago: Feeder cattle and calves 3.00-5.00 lower, yearling cattle at the full decline. Demand moderate. Calf and feeder flesh very attractive to buyers and generally medium to thin, few fleshy; weigh-ups average. Quality of supply plain to average but this easily offset by thinner flesh conditions. Very few cattle off wheat in the supply as grazing was extremely sparse this season. In normal grazing conditions January is the first of the three off wheat runs. Slaughter cows and bulls 1.00-2.00 higher with good demand and widespread buyer participation. Packers bought 80 percent of the 600 cows and bulls. Receipts this week 10,675; last week 440; last year 16,363. Supply consisted of 67 percent yearlings and calves over 600 lbs; 27 percent calves under 600 lbs; 6 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis. Feeder Steers: Medium and Large 1 300-350 lbs (317 lbs) 64.00-70.50 (68.55); 350-400 lbs (380 lbs) 62.00-67.00 (65.56); 400-500 lbs (450 lbs) 60.50-65.50, lot very thin 69.00 (65.38); 500-550 lbs (517 lbs) 59.50-64.50 (62.57); 550-600 lbs (579 lbs) 57.50-63.50 (60.81); 600-700 lb calves (650 lbs) 57.00-62.75 (59.80); 650-700 lb yearlings (677 lbs) 60.50-63.00 (61.96); 700-800 lbs (750 lbs) 60.00-64.50 (61.21); 800-900 lbs (850 lbs) 59.00-63.25 (60.91); 900-1000 lbs (950 lbs) 57.25-60.00 (57.34).

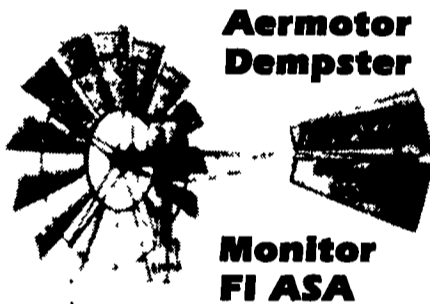
