JANUARY 17, 1996 Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds continued to slow. Seller offerings increased and excess supplies were generally difficult to place. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were heavy to desirable. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 62 to 73 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to weak. In the parts complex, most items continued to increase in availability, paticularly boneless skinless breasts and various leg cuts. Bone-in breasts and wings were generally adequate, but in a better balance.


