Prices were higher. The market tone was firm. Demand was mostly for less-than-trucklot volumes at current high price levels, and trading was light to moderate. Floor stocks were generally adequate. Shell egg supplies were adequate, and prices were higher. Liquid and frozen eggs processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending January 13, 1996 were 14% less than last week, and 19% less than the same week last year.

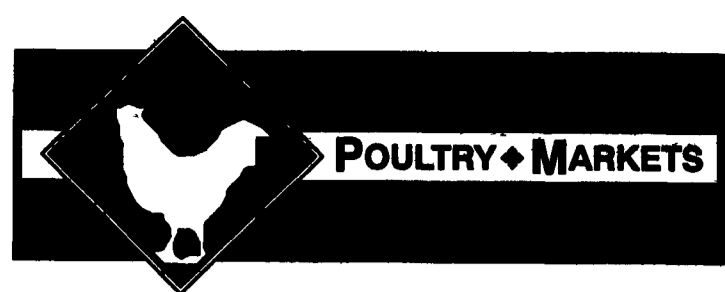

Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 54 to 65 cents. Trade sentiment was steady at best. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate for a lackluster buying interest. Breast items were in best demand. Wings were in excess.
