 Wheat bids continued higher in reaction to China's very large wheat purchase. Corn bids mostly lower, due to light profit taking

but good export sales limited declines. Soybean bids fell slightly lower on weaker meal demand and lower corn bids. Wheat 1 to 6 cents higher. Corn 1 to 2 cents lower except Omaha 4 cents higher. Sorghum 1 to 4 cents lower. Soybeans 1 to 3 cents lower. The announcement that China bought around 1.5 million metric tons of US wheat was positive to bids. However, the long anticipation of the sale and tight stock figures kept increases under control. Indications additional purchases are in the works may keep wheat bids on the upward side. Corn and soybean bids were mostly lower, despite the foreign sales overnight, especially for corn. Some fund selling was noted in corn and bean pits after yesterday's gains. Weakness in soybean meal dragged beans slightly lower.
