 Prices were unchanged to lower in the Northeast and Midwest, and unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was cautiously steady to weak. Demand was light to moderate, occasionally better where featured.

Supplies were at least adequate and available with inter-dealer inquiry still light, but somewhat improved to supply an upcoming export order. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate for the limited demand, and the trade sentiment remained barely steady to weak for the lower prices. Light hen offerings were more than adequate for the slow demand.

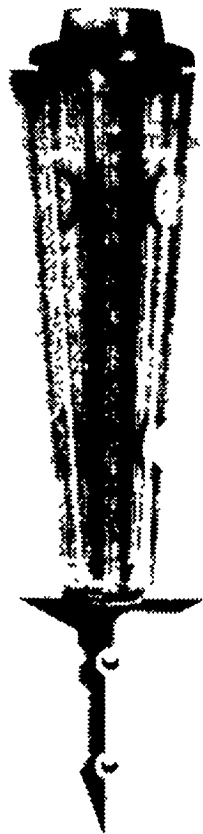

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
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
