Wheat bids turned mostly lower due to profit taking on the board and forecasts for mow in winter wheat growing areas. However, indications that China as well as other countries may seek US wheat, offered light support. Com bids were slightly higher from recent good export sales and fund buying. Spillover strength from corn pits and a jump in soyoil demand, strengthened bean bids. Transportation problems from cold temperatures in the Midwest also pushed bids higher. Wheat 7 to 11 cents lower except Portland 1 to 2 cents higher. Corn steady to 2 cents higher. Sorghum 2 to 6 cents higher. Soybeans 2 to 6 cents higher. Very cold temperatures continued to blast the Great Plains States, keeping traders concerned. However, some profit taking after Tuesday's higher close, weighed on wheat bids. Com bids were slightly higher as crops remain in strong hands. Good export demand for corn this week, added strength. Ideal growing weather in South Africa and Australia, limited gains in com and bean bids. Soybean meal demand was weak again today but strenght in com and soyoil, underpinned bids. 

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
