According to Floyd Huber, president of the PPPC, the money raised at the auctions is used to fund expenses for board members to travel to Washington for three days in September to lobby for the concerns of the state producers.

The number one concern of producers right now is the state of the Farm Bill, according to Huber, herd manager for the Steve Burkholder Farm in Fleetwood.

Huber said the items at the auction are donated by individuals and agribusinesses toward-use for legi-slative activities. "There are quite a variety of items," he said, including craft items, gift certificates for home and business equipment, and certificates for breeding stock. This year, certificates to purchase boars will be donated by

several companies.

Also included are items such as water nipples, fans, creep feed, thermometers, quilts, clocks, out-door grills — "a really big variety of items," said Huber. The higher valued items will be auctioned off in the live auction, and the lower value items will be reserved for the silent auction.

Presiding over the auctions are Nelson Beam and John Reininger, members of the PPPC board.

For producers, the entire day promises a variety of educational topics. One family event includes the annual Keystone Pork Bowl, which pits youth groups in a question-and-answer contest. The Pork Bowl will be held at the Lebanon County Extension Office beginning with preliminary eliminations at 9:30 a.m. and final eli-




