

Nearly 400 are expected to attend this year's expo. This year's meeting will reature a trade show with 47 exhibits and educational seminars for producers.

At the seminars in the West Hall, speaking will be Dr. Lou Moore, Penn State professor of ag economics, who will deliver his hog market outlook at 9:30 a.m. Dr. Dennis DePietre, nationally recognized ag economist from the University of Missouri, will speak about the state of the swine industry at 10:15 a.m.

Dr. Robert Goodband, professor of animal science from Kansas State and noted authority on swine nutrition, will provide tips on phase and split sex feeding at 11:15 a.m.

In the afternoon seminars in the West Hall, Dr. Robert Kauffman, well-known professor of meat science at the University of Wisconsin, will provide his perspective on potential problems with pork quality at 2:15 p.m. Dr. Earl Dotson, vice president for producer education at the National Pork Producers Council (NPPC), will provide a summary of the National Genetic Evaluation Program, recently sponsored by the NPPC. Dotson will speak at 3:15 p.m.
