

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was sufficient to keep the light offerings of 3 pound and smaller sizes well cleared; 3.5 pound and heavier weights were adequate for the mostly moderate demand. Live supplies ranged moderate to heavy; weights were desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were generally heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 51 to 62 cents Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. In the parts complex, bonein breasts were generally held with confidence. Boneless skinless breasts were irregularly distributed, but adequate overall. Leg items and wings were in generally good balance.

Demand was light to moderate, and continued to focus on less-than-trucklot volumes. Floor stocks were adequate. Raw material costs decreased, and offerings of shell eggs were adequate. Edible liquid and frezen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending January 27, 1996 were 7% greater than last week, and 7% less than the same week last year.
