Soybeans 5 to 7 cents lower. Wheat bids declined sharply mid-week, pressured by the lack of any new foreign sales or tenders. Corn and soybean bids followed wheat lower on lack of export demand. Profit taking set in on the board due to continued talk of liquidation in the livestock sector, also pushing corn bids lower. 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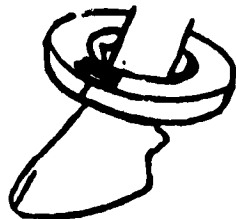
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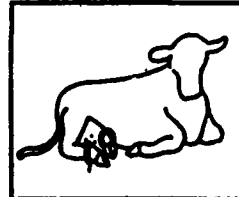
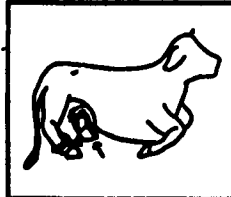
