Grain and soybean bids soared, today, as fund buying in all pits and a slight pick up in export business strengthened bids. Crop concerns and continued tightening of US and World stocks was also a supportive factor. Wheat 7 to 13 cents higher. Corn 5 to 7 cents higher. Sorghum 10 to 12 cents higher. Soybeans 9 to 14 cents higher. Active fund buying on the board and stronger corn bids pushed wheat bids sharply higher. Continued reports that US and World stocks are becoming severely depleted finally caught traders attention. Some export sales were noted but nothing substantial to report. Corn bids also moved sharply higher in reaction to fund buying and additional export sales overnight.
