George was one of nine presidents who never attended college and, like every president until Jimmy Carter, was born at home. Like virtually every president since, he wore glasses, at least some of the time, and

his hair — even if it hadn't been powdered — was predominantly white. (Monroe and Pierce were the exceptions; they had handsome dark brown hair.) In his youth, Washington was considered romantic and emotional — and loved to dance.


