higher; lighter weights steady. Heifer calves and most feeder heifers steady; exception noted on over 800 lb heifers 2.00 higher. Demand moderate to good with buyers less selective than last week. Quality average to many attractive. Weigh-ups gaunt to average. Feeder flesh medium to slightly fleshy with flesh attributed to wheat. Calves and stockers medium to thin fleshed. Most of Oklahoma wheat country continues dry. Despite dry conditions much of the crop has responded well to several weeks of warm weather in February. Slaughter cows firm. Slaughter bulls .50 lower. Packer demand moderate to good for cows, moderate at best for bulls. Large run of bulls with several fed bulls in consist. 300 cows and bulls sold with 80 percent to packers. 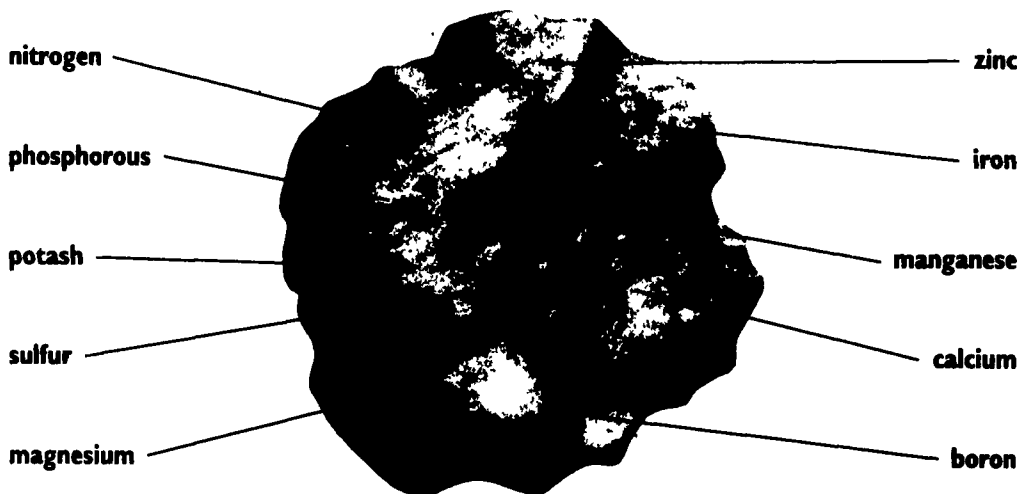
