4-H Offers Leadership **Training In Shooting Sports**

YOUNGSVILLE (Warren Co.) - Pennsylvania 4-H is conducting a shooting sports leader training program and instructor certification course for adults interested in working with youths ages 8-18.

It will be held May 17-19, at Camp Harmony Heart, Jermyn (near Scranton).

According to Sanford Smith. Warren County Extension Agent, the workshop will be funded in part by a \$2,500 grant from the National Rifle Association through their "Friends of the NRA" program and a \$600 grant from the Federal Cartridge Company.

Programming will involve spe-

cialized training and certification for instructors in the NRA/4-H rifle, pistol, and shotgun shooting sports programs.

Archery participants will receive National Archery Association Level 1 certification. Program participants will be certified to organize 4-H project clubs and conduct instruction in these program areas.

Several related projects and activities will also be introduced during this year's training including "Woodworking for Wildlife," "Wildlife Through The Seasons," "Endangered Species" and the Penn State 4-H Habitat Evaluation contest.

Average Farm Feed Costs For Handy Reference

To help farmers across the state to have handy reference of commodity input costs in their feeding operations for DHIA record sheets or to develop livestock feed cost data, here's last week's average costs of various ingredients as compiled from regional reports across the state of Pennsylvania. Remember these are averages so you will need to adjust your figures up or down according to your location and the quality of your crop.

Corn, No. 2y - 3.86 bu. 6.90 cwt. Wheat, No. 2 - 4.93 bu. 8.23 CWL

Barley, No. 3 - 2.96 bu. 6.32 **CWL**

Oats, No. 2 - 2.16 bu. 6.72 cwl. Soybeans, No. 1 - 7.18 bu. 11.99

Ear Corn 93.33 ton 4.67 cwt. Alfalfa Hay - 110.50 ton 5.53

Mixed Hay - 104.50 ton 5.23 Cwt.

Timothy Hay - 104.25 ton 5.21 CWL.


