development.

Forgey believes it is important to leave about 3 inches of plant residue to allow for rapid regrowth. The calves are kept in a separate grazing system to provide improved early development.

Gradually, Forgey is adjusting to seasonal dairying. They transitioned the herd to March and April freshing and, with all the calves coming in a two-month period, can run them in one group all the way to freshening.

One successful approach is to feed calves milk in groups of 15 on barrels which have nipples attached to hoses which bring the milk up from the bottom. This seems to eliminate scours. Forgey indicated they have not had a case of scours in two years, raising about 75 calves each year.

This seasonal freshing system allows Forgey to dry the entire herd all at once and have an extended time to do routine maintenance to the milking facility.

Excess forage is harvested from paddocks in May, June, and July in

the form of dry hay or round bale silage. The bales are triplewrapped with 2-mil white plastic

and stored outside where they are fed in the non-grazing months.

In grazing, it is important to be careful about mixtures (not to combine red clover and grazing-

type alfalfa). Also, grazing managers should periodically walk the fields to determine when pastures will be ready.

Grazing requires a greater deal of management than conventional, confinement dairying, according to the dairyman. But the rewards in more consistent milk production, less diseases, a healthier cow, and low input costs can pay off if done

On Wednesday at the two-day conference, other topics include presentations on what type of watering system is needed, fencing requirements, how to maintain paddocks and lanes, and other

ways to "fine-tune" the entire grazing season, including hot season grazing and raising calves and beef on pasture.
