Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was mostly moderate and centered mainly on adequate to well balanced supplies of 3 pound and smaller sizes. Larger sizes were fully adequate to ample. Live supplies were generally moderate; weights varied and were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 50 to 62 cents. Trade sentiment ranged just steady to fully steady. In the parts complex, breast items continued short for immediate delivery. Leg items were ample. Interest in wings continued to build; however, supplies remained ample


