Yield Contest Winners Announced For Nation's Top Crop

ST. LOUIS, Mo. — Despite a tumultuous growing season resulting in a smaller U.S. corn harvests, winners of the National Corn Growers Association (NCGA) 1995 National Corn Yield Contest brought in some significant-sized crops.

Corn yield entries tabulated from the 27 farmers who took first, second, and third place in nine separate classes of the popular NCGA contest ranged from 185 to 314 bushels per acre.

"The men and women who participated in this contest produced some impressive crops despite a great deal of adversity caused by a wet spring, stiffling-hot late summer and an early frost," said NCGA President Bill Northey. "We face uncertainty due to weather day in and day out. Currently we face additional uncertainty because a new farm program remains unresolved in Washington. We urge Congress and President Clinton to establish one with complete flexibility, an adequate safety net, and to put it in place soon," the Iowa farmer said.

The goal of the NCGA National Corn Yield Contest is to encourage corn growers to develop new, efficient production techniques that improve corn profitability. The highest average yields came from growers who used no-till practices.

More than 3,300 corn growers took part in the contest, about 200 more than in 1994.


