political hurdles in the state Legislature for years, Eckel said that the timing is right for such a referendum.

In short, Eckel said that the bottling industry has been against such a provision because of the associated increase in costs and have lobbied well to prevent passage of such a bill.

He said it is felt that if the citzenry is given an opportunity to vote their opinion on the issue it may have the strength to override dissenting efforts by the bottling industry.

The proposal would place on the ballot of the next election following the passage of the legislation into law a referendum.

The form of the question would follow the form of, "Shall the General Assembly enact legislation, to be entitled the Returnable Beverage Container Act, which will place a nominal charge on every nonbiodegradable or nonphotodegradable (destroyed by light) beverage container of 16 ounces or less sold in this Commonwealth. with the charges collected to be returned to consumers upon return of the containers to recycling centers, retailers or beverage manufacturers?"

He said that PFB also supports increasing the state's littering fine from \$300 to \$1,000 and increasing enforcement. The fine has been at \$300 for 20 years, Eckel said.

Given the Ridge Administra-

tion's emphasis on promoting tourism in Pennsylvania, as evidenced in part by the creation of the cabinet-level Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) to manage state parks and bring them up to grade, it is believed that now is the time to act on getting a bottle bill.

Other issues Eckel discussed include property rights (He said his philosophy was that government owed the property owner for any potential losses due to any regulation.), and reform of local taxing
