PRICES WERE UNCHANGED TO HIGHER FOR THE LARGE SIZES IN THE PHILADELPHIA AREA, AND THE BALANCE OF PRICES WERE UNCHANGED. THE MARKET TONE WAS MOSTLY STEADY WITH SOME STRENGTH NOTED WHERE LARGE SUPPLIES WERE SOUGHT. DEMAND WAS FAIR TO GOOD. SUPPLIES WERE GENERALLY ADEQUATE FOR ALL SIZES AND COLORS EXCEPT HEAVY WHITE EGGS WERE SOMETIMES SOUGHT, AND MEDIUM WHITE EGGS WERE OFTEN OFFERED AND SOLD TO EXPORTERS. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE NO MORE THAN ADEQUATE.

Mostly prices were generally unchanged to higher. Undertone was fully steady to firm. Demand was light to occasionally moderate on whites and blends, mostly good on balance. Floor stocks were clearing and usually in close balance with requirements. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending March 2, 1996 were 8% more than last week, and 12% less than the same week last year.

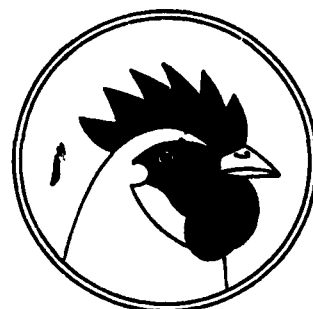
