rtist Vincent van Gogh might have been happy to hear that the National Garden Bureau has proclaimed **1**1996 the Year of the Sunflower. Born on March 30, 1853, in the Netherlands, van Gogh painted for a mere ten years, but produced over 800 paintings, with his sunflower series counted among his best. To Native Americans, the sunflower meant food; its seed is about 24 percent protein and contains thiamine, vitamin E, iron, phosphorus, potassium, and calcium.


