### **Tilling**

Tilling is one of the most critical steps in making a garden. When properly done, tilling enhances the quality of your soil, makes garden maintenance easier, and results in a higher yield. It's never a good idea to till just after a big rain, or when the soil is too wet. To test for proper

tilling conditions, grab a handful of soil, squeeze to form a ball, and open your hand quickly. If the soil ball falls apart, it's ready to till. If it retains its shape, it would be better to wait a day or two before starting your tilling. Tilling extremely wet soil can lead to soil compaction. If the ball crumbles or won't even form a shape, it's too dry and needs to be watered until the consistency is right. You don't want to till when soil is overly dry. If there's no moisture in the

soil, turning it can lead to erosion.

When storing tillers inside, make sure that the fuel tanks are drained and run the tiller until it quits from fuel starvation. This will prevent varnish build-up in the carburetor and prevent any danger of gas fumes in the storage area. Before storing your tiller for the winter, wash the tiller. Clean

off excess dirt and oil, especially in the tines and undercarriage of the tiller; disconnect the sparkplug; wipe the tines and undercarriage with an oil-soaked rag. This will prevent rust and insure a long life for your tiller.

Frequent tilling of your garden aerates the soil and destroys weeds and unwanted garden pests. Using the right equipment for the job is essential. BCS has a tiller for every need, with a full range of attachments that make them useful in the yard as well as the garden.

#### Caring for Your Garden

- ◆ Cultivate early. The best time to kill weeds is when they sprout.
- ◆ Thin ruthlessly. Leave enough space between plants so they can mature easily.
- ♦ Be careful around the plants. One careless swipe of the hoe can destroy a lot of work and future vegetables.
- Stay out of a wet garden. Rust disease of beans and other diseases are easily spread when a picker goes through a row of wet plants.
- Water the ground, not the plants. Wet foliage can cause fungus diseases. Apply water to the base of the plant at sundown, so the heat of the day will not deplete its moisture.
- ★ Keep weeds under control by tillage or mulching. Weeds take moisture, light and nutrients away from vegetable plants.
