Compared to last week: Feeder and stocker cattle 3.00-4.00 lower. Demand moderate. Buyers very selective for flesh and fill. Feeder cattle in medium to fleshy condition with several fed-at. Weigh-ups average to full. Quality plain to average. Last week's sharp increase in grain futures and lower CME cattle futures lowered live markets. Slaughter cows and bulls 2.00-3.00 lower. Demand moderate at best for both packer and replacement cows. Total of 425 cows and bulls sold, 85 percent to packers. Receipts this week 8,950; last week 6,107; last year 9,583. Supply consisted of 65 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 30 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs; 5 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
