

NY Phil Frozen Eggs

APRIL 26, 1996

Prices were lower for whole egg and blends, and unchanged for yolks and whites. The market tone began the week firm for yolks, but as shell egg prices fell, the undertone for whole egg and blends weakened, whites were barely steady to steady, and yolks were steady. Demand resumed a more immediate nature, and was mostly moderate to meet current needs. Floor stocks were usually adequate.

Shell egg and liquid offerings increased, and prices began to decrease mid-week. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 20, 1996 were 2% more than last week, and 1% more than the same week last year.

Prices were unchanged to lower in the Northeast and Midwest, and prices were unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was steady to weak. Demand was mixed from poor to moderate with retail movement light, and food service generally better. Supplies were adequate to ample and readily available. Breaking stock supplies were at least adequate for the light to fair demand, and prices were lower; surplus graded eggs continued to be offered to breakers. Live hen offerings were at least adequate for the limited demand, and plant schedules continued to limit off farm movement.
