Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was good. Seller offerings of 3 pound and smaller sizes were closely cleared to short; larger sizes were adequate and clearing well at most plants. Live supplies were moderate with weights ranging desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 61 to 73 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to firm. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breast were adequate. Bone-in breast were in good balance to short. Other items were noted as well balanced and clearing.

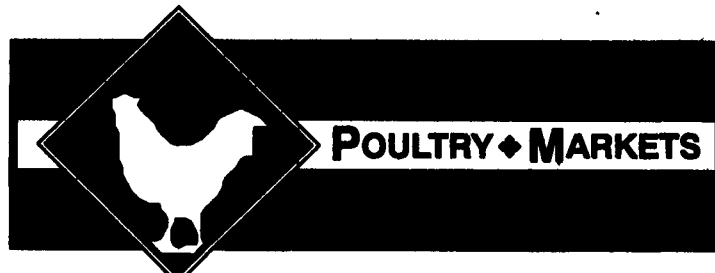
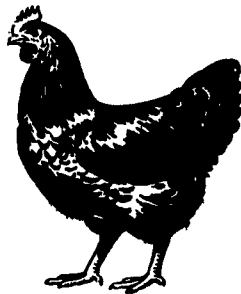
