MAY 3, 1996

Prices were lower for whole egg and whites, mostly unchanged for sugar yolks, but mostly higher on salted yolks. The undertone was irregular on whole but generally firm on yolks items. Demand was moderate but improved. Supplies were sufficient but starting to clear.

Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending April 27, 1996 were 2% more than last week, and 13% more than the same week last year.

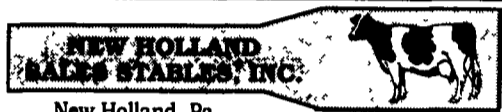
