ammertus, Pancras, and Gervais (or Gervatius) are the "Three Chilly Saints" whose feast days are May 11, 12, and 13. The three became known in weatherlore for predicting what were, traditionally, the three coldest days of the month. Germans knew them as "Icemänner" or the Iceman Days and farmers knew better than to plant vulnerable seedlings before the Icemen had come and gone. The English and French saw the Three Chilly Saints as harbingers of a late spring frost, leading to the weatherlore that "St. Pancras Day (May 12) never passes without frost."

Compared to last Monday: Feeder cattle 3.00-5.00 higher; stocker cattle 1.00-3.00 higher. Demand excellent for all classes and grades with broad buyer participation. Plainer cattle that have taken heavy discounts the past several weeks are up 6.00. Quality and conditions not as attractive as last week. Quality plain through attractive. Weigh-ups average to full, some gaunt. Feeder flesh medium to moderately fleshy; stocker flesh thin to medium. Slaughter cows 2.00-3.00 higher. Slaughter bulls 1.00 higher. Packer demand excellent. Trade active with very good demand. Total of 500 cows and bulls sold with 80 percent to packers. Drought conditions continue thru much of Oklahoma. Haying and grazing conditions are the big worry now. Receipts this week 10,100; last week 8,335; last year 7,537. Supply consisted of 71 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 24 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 ibs; 5 percent cows and bulls. 
