2 eggs


1 large container COTTAGE CHEESE

Cook shells as instructed on box. Rinse and let cool in cold water. Mix eggs and cheeses. Pour some sauce in bottom of an 8" x 10" baking dish. Fill cooled shells with egg and cheese mixture. Make 1 layer in the bottom of the dish with shells. Pour over sauce, then put a layering sauce, shells, sauce, cheese, shells, etc. until finished. Top with sauce and shredded cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 30-45 minutes. Serves 6-8.
