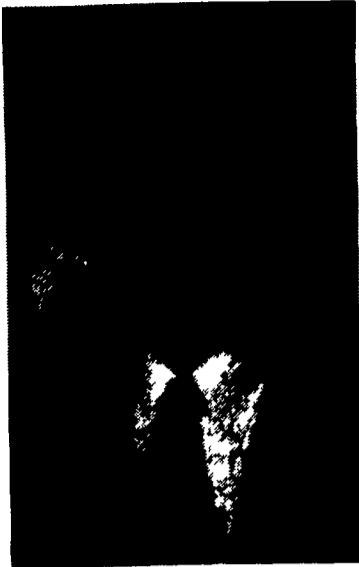


Keystone Announces Scholarship Winners

Foundation Updates Teachers On Ag, Environment

GROVE CITY (Mercer Co.) — Agriculture Awareness Foundation of Pennsylvania (AAFPA) recently conducted the first of several regional workshops to update the graduates of the summer Agriculture in the Classroom program about the interdependence of agriculture and the environment.

Graduates and their teacher-colleagues have been invited to attend one of six regional workshops funded by a grant from the state Department of Environmental Protection.

With materials provided by the Pennsylvania Soybean Board and the Pennsylvania Corn Growers Association, teachers learned about the vast array of environmentally friendly products made from soybeans and corn. They ex-

perienced first-hand the teaching aids and materials available by agricultural organizations and the impact these products have on their lives.

With the assistance from the Crawford County and Bedford County Conservation Districts, the teachers learned about the importance of soil and the care that farmers take to preserve the top soil so important to their livelihood.

Teachers also exchanged ideas about how they are using the agricultural lessons they learned during the summer program in their classrooms and share pictures of projects their students are doing in their classes.

Three more regional workshops are planned for June 18 in Wellsboro, June 19 in Frackville, and June 20 in West Chester. Any teacher interested in learning more about agriculture and the environment and how to present that to their own classes are welcome. Registration must be received by June 10. There is no cost to the participant.
