

NY Phil Frozen Eggs MAY 17, 1996

Prices were unchanged to higher for whole egg and sugared yolks, and the balance of prices were generally unchanged. The market tone was steady for whites, and fully steady to firm for the remaining categories; yolks were in the firmest position. Demand was fairly active with increased buyer inquiry due in part to overall egg market strengthening, and higher prices. Floor stocks were no more than adequate for current orders. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending May 11, 1996 were 1% more than last week, and 15% more than last year.


