Ince World War I, poppies have been a symbol of remembrance at Memorial Day, formerly Decoration Day The red poppy was used to symbolize the blood of those who died in service to their countries. After World War I, veterans sold artificial red poppies to help raise money for French and Belgian war orphans Today, donations to veterans' groups are often marked with a token paper red poppy The crinkled crepe paper closely resembles the texture of the real poppy (Papaver), which is grown as a hardy annual or perennial. "In Flanders fields

raisins, chopped
1 cup chopped

wainuts

in flour

1/2 cup currants,

washed, dried, tossed




