Pot O'Gold Entries Due

REYNOLDSBURG, Ohio — Entries are due July 1 for the 1996 Pot O'Gold Production Contest.

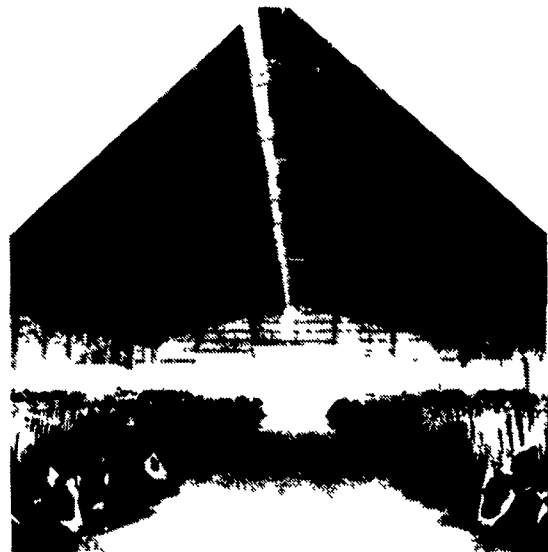
Juniors between the ages of seven and 19 enter the Pot O'Gold Sale Production Contest by purchasing one of the animals consigned to either the Western National Pot O'Gold Sale in Puyallup, Wash. or the All American Pot O'Gold Sale in Louisville, Ky. Animals eligible for the 1996 contest would have been purchased in 1993. Funding for the contest equals 17 percent of the gross of the two sales.

The records completed by heifers purchased in these sales must

be submitted to the American Jersey Cattle Association no later than July 1 to be eligible for competition.

The heifer must calve before reaching 30 months of age. The actual first lactation production is adjusted to the mature equivalent (305-day, 2x milking, age and month of calving). Adjusted records are then ranked according to the mature equivalent protein to determine the placings in the contest.

Juniors, related or un-related, may form a partnership to purchase animals in the Pot O'Gold sales as long as all other requirements are met.
