M.P. claims that he "retired" from farming a few years ago so now he only works 60 hours a week for Marty. He may be "retired" from farming but does not seem "tired" of it.



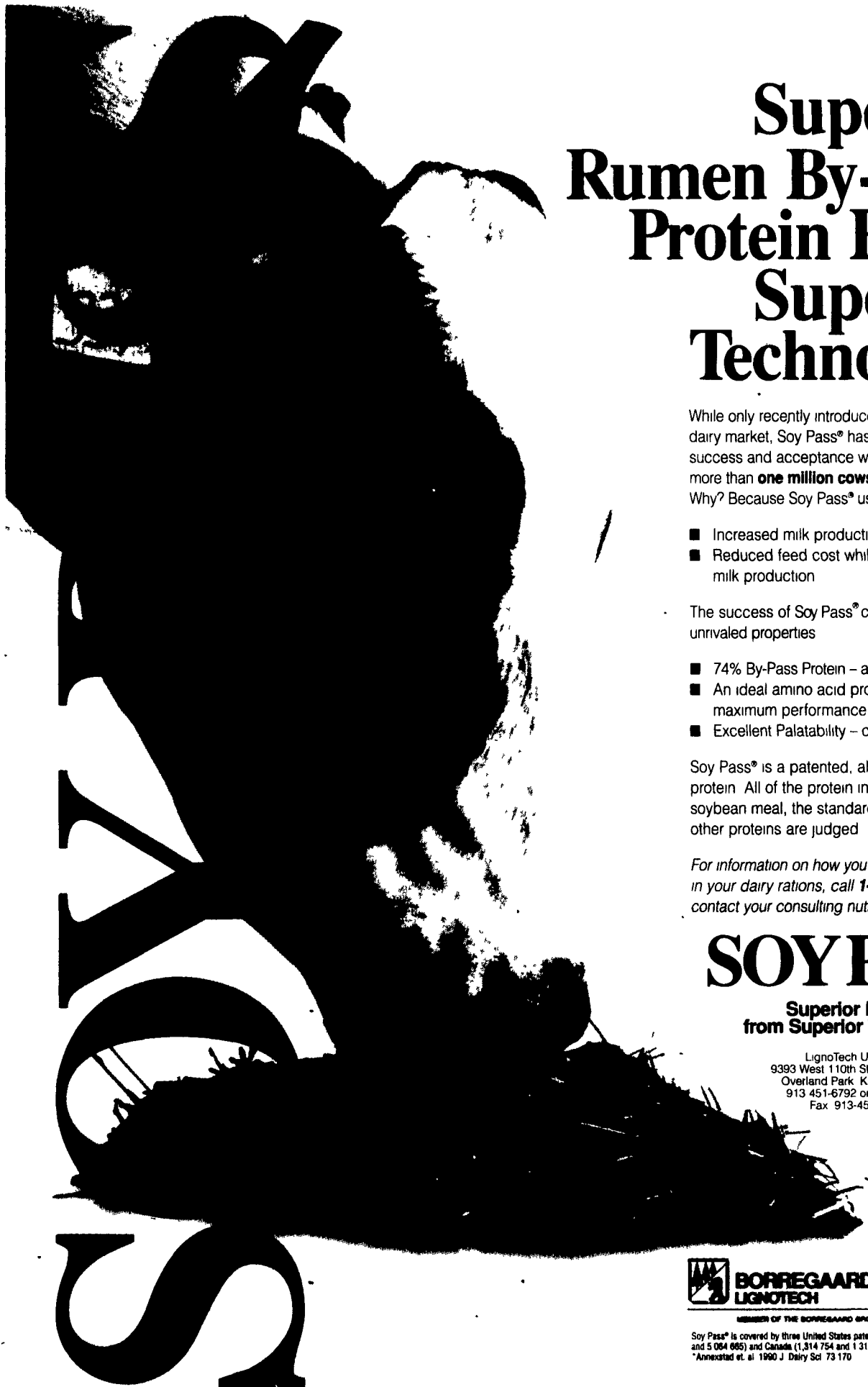
