demand, and the trade sentiment was about
steady except for light weight eggs which
were weak. Spent hen supplies easily satisfied
slaughter plant needs.

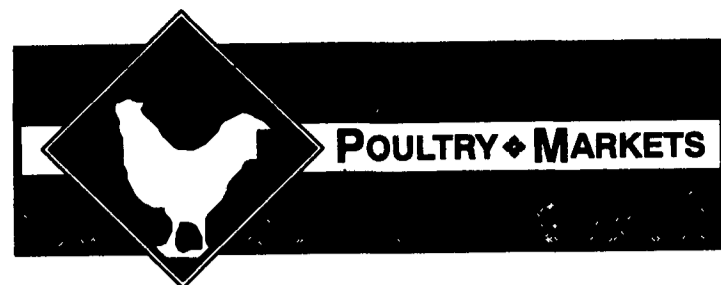

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds varied. 3.0 pound and smaller sizes were in short supply; larger sizes were fully adequate to ample and often slow to clear. Live supplies were moderate; weights were generally heavier than desired. Processing schedules were moderate to heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 70 to 82 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. In the parts complex, boneless skinnless breasts were fully adequate. Supplies of bone-in breasts varied from adequate to available and slow to clear. Legs, leg quarters and wings were no more than adequate.
