USDA-OK Dept Ag Market News Oklahoma National Stockyards - Weekly Cattle Summary

Compared to last Tuesday: Feeder cattle 2.00-4.00 higher. Demand very good for feeder cattle and calves. Feeder flesh mostly thin to medium. Weigh-ups average to full. Quality of supply average. Supply included a large percentage of cattle from out of state, mainly brahman cross cattle from Texas. General rains lately have provided a brighter outlook for summer grass. Calf demand responded accordingly. Recent declines in grain markets coupled with strong fall CME slaughter futures have boosted demand for feeder cattle. Slaughter cows uneven, Canner and Cutter steady to \$1.00 lower, Utility steady to 1.00 higher. Demand moderate with best demand centered on Boning Utility. Trade fairly active although Texas buyers continue quiet as Texas cow runs remain heavy. 640 cows and bulls sold with 90 percent to packers. Receipts this week 15,250; last week 5,048; last year 12,580. Supply consisted of 75 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 21 percent calves and light yearlings under 600 lbs; 4 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.


