Wheat and bean bids continued to decline, today, pressured by lack of export activity and improved planting weather

Corn bids moved moderately higher due to China's overnight purchase and fund buying on the board. Wheat 9 to 13 cents lower. Corn 6 to 8 cents higher. Sorghum 12 cents higher. Soybeans 1 to 9 cents lower. Warmer, drier weather and farmers are back in fields. Spring wheat planting is progressing and winter wheat harvest continues to pressure bids. The lack of new export business so far this week, also weighed on bids. Corn bids were moderately higher due to good export interest from China. Fund buying was noted on the board. 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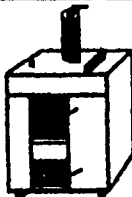
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
