Earlier in the month, Mary L. Smith entered her Black Walnut Cake with Buttercream icing in a dairy bake-off competition. Her real dairy recipe follows.

Black Walnut Cake 3 cup butter 1% cup sugar 3 eggs 1 cup milk 1 teaspoon vanilla 2% cup flour 3 teaspoon baking powder 1 teaspoon salt

1½ cup black walnuts Mix all ingredients together and

bake for one hour at 300 degrees F in a greased and floured 9"x13" cake pan.

**Buttercream Icing** % cup butter

2-3 tablespoons solid vegetable shortening

1 teaspoon vanilla

¼ teaspoon salt

4 cups confectioners sugar (add

1 cup at a time 4 tablespoons milk

Blend butter, shortening, vanilla and salt together until creamy. Add sugar one cup at a time. Add milk to thin. Blend all until smooth. Spread on cake that has cooled.
