Prune azaleas after they've finished blooming, and thin fruits such as apples, pears, and peaches if too many flowers have set fruit. Tend to weeding and stake plants early.

SHRIMP GRECCO

- 2 pounds raw shrimp
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup dry vermouth
- 2 cups canned crushed tomatoes
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1 tablespoon oregano
- 1 tablespoon basil
- salt and pepper to taste
- dash of Tabasco
- 1/2 pound feta cheese, cut in chunks

Sauté garlic and onion in olive oil until limp. Add vermouth; simmer 3 minutes. Add tomatoes, tomato paste, oregano, and basil. Simmer 10 minutes; add salt, pepper, and Tabasco to taste. Add shrimp and cook 3 to 4 minutes, until pink. Add feta cheese and cook until shrimp is completely cooked and cheese is heated but not melted. Serve with rice.

Makes 6 servings.

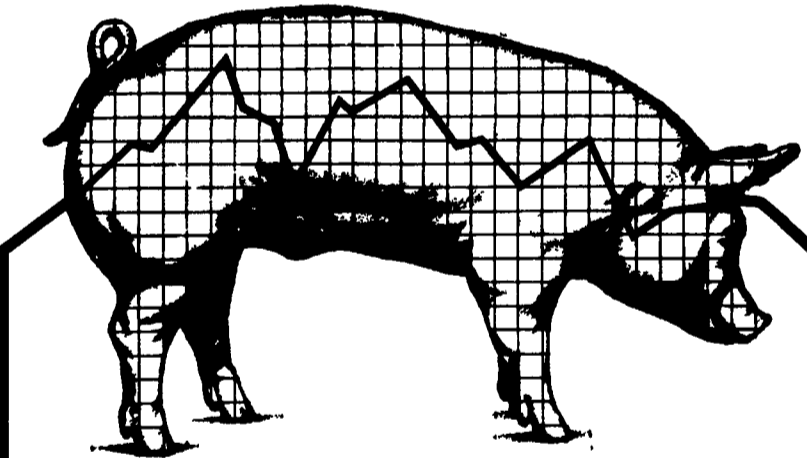

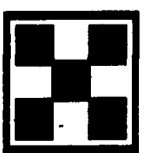
