McEvoy owns and operates a Marin County, Calif., olive oil producing ranch and is director emeritus and former chairman of the San Francisco Chronicle publishing company. Dietel, a former AFT board member, serves as chairman of the National Center for Nonprofit Boards and president of the Pierson-Lovelace Foundation. He has a farm in Flint Hill, Va.

"We are pleased to have three individuals of this calibre joining our board of directors," said AFT President Ralph Grossi, a thirdgeneration northern California rancher. "Eileen Growald brings to us the same strong commitment and dedication to farmland conservation and stewardship as her mother. CRI Signs Pact

Wis. — Cooperative Resources International (CRI), a global marketer of United States cattle semen has signed a cooperative marketing agreement with New Zealand's largest dairy cooperative, Livestock Improvement Cooperative (LIC), a subsidary of the New Zealand Dairy Board.

LIC sells about 2.14 million unites of semen annually, about 1.4 million of which are sold as fresh semen. The have about 75 percent of the artificial insemination business in New Zealand, which has 2.8 million dairy cows in 14,500 herds.

CRI is heralding the agreement as a historic event, in a news release this week.
