Demand continued to center around current needs, and trading volume was moderate. Floor stocks were adequate. Shell egg supplies were also adequate from regular sources, and prices were unchanged. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 8, 1996 were 15% more than last week, and 3% less than the same week last year. Most plants ran full schedules.

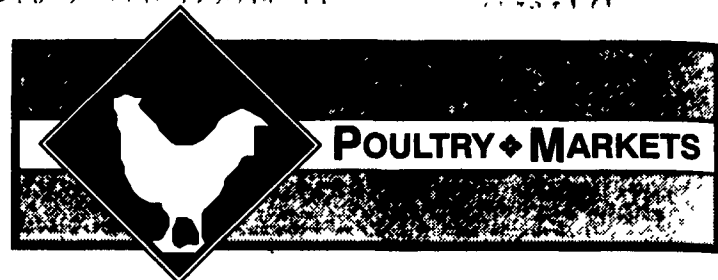

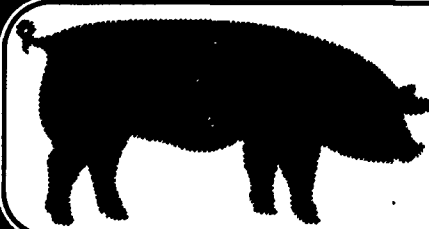
