Crop Tips At Field Day

HOYTVILLE, Ohio --- New techniques in field crop production will be on display July 30 in Hoytville as the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center and Ohio State University Extension host the 1996 Field Crops Day.

"Across the Midwest, there's a growing — a rapidly growing interest in narrow row corn," said Paul Houdashelt, manager of the Hoytville branch of the OARDC and coordinator of the event. The field day will feature researchers and a grower who has been working with narrow-row corn.

Another session will focus on the use of bio-solids on farms, "a growing area for our clientele," Houdashelt said.

Other presentations will focus on optimal use of corn performance trials, herbicide-tolerant crops, using an oats cover crop, and more. The use of oats as a cover crop may be part of a proposed federally funded sediment reduction plan.

Field Crops Day will also include displays from OARDC, Ohio State's Agricultural Technical Institute, and OSU's College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences.

The event is free and open to the public. It will take place from 9 a.m. till noon on July 30, rain or shine.

"The only difference if it rains would be that the programs will be presented indoors instead of outdoors," said Houdashelt. "We just won't have a farm tour if it rains."
