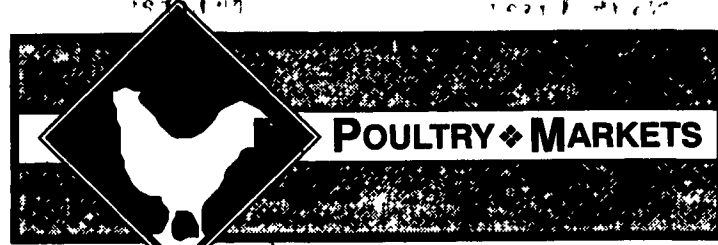

Sugared yolk prices were generally unchanged, and the balance of prices were unchanged to lower. The market tone was mostly steady for yolks, and steady at best for the balance. Demand was light to moderate, and occasionally better than expected for a traditionally quiet week. Floor stocks were adequate. Edible liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection for the week ending July 6, 1996 in the Eastern region were 11% less than the prior week, and 3% more than the same week last year.

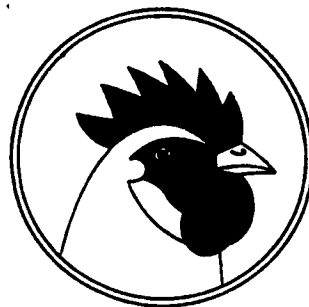
