**OK City Feeder Cattle**

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK  
 JULY 17, 1996

Compared to last week: Feeder cattle and calves firm. Demand moderate. Quality of supply average to many plain, few attractive. Flesh condition of feeder cattle and calves generally medium. Weigh-ups average to mostly full. General rains throughout central Oklahoma has improved pasture conditions but not much response in the calf market. Best demand for cattle still centers on heavy weight feeders Slaughter cows 3.00-4.00 lower. Slaughter bulls 2.00 lower. Demand moderate. Large runs of cows continue in Oklahoma and have resumed in Texas following the holiday week. Thus packers are well set for numbers and are not aggressive buyers. Beef cow slaughter during June was 31 percent greater than June of 1995. 765 cows and bulls sold with 80 percent to packers. Receipts this week 12,050; last week 14,389; last year 10,588. Supply consisted of 66 percent yearlings over 600 lbs; 28 percent calves under 600 lbs; 6 percent cows and bulls. 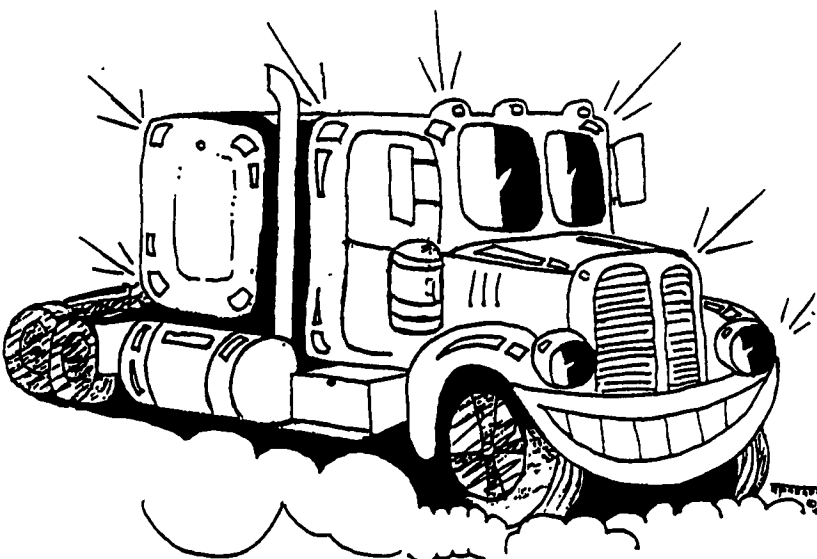
