Uwners: License Your Dogs

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) - Agriculture Secretary Charles C. Brosius encouraged dog owners to adhere to the law by licensing their pets. The agriculture department is responsible for administering the state's Dog Law.

"A dog license allows enforcement officers to positively identify a stray dog, providing both ownership and vaccination information," said Brosius. "Those owners who choose not to obey the law could be responsible for fines up to \$300 plus court costs."

Brosius reminded owners that after a 48-hour waiting period, an unlicensed dog may be adopted by a new owner or event euthanized if needed.

The cost of a dog license is \$3 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$5 for a regular license. Proceeds from the sale of licenses are used to enforce dog laws and investigate animal bite incidents, including quarantining animals if necessary. Funds are also used for programs to educate children on how to be responsible pet owners and reimburse livestock owners whose animals have been injured by dogs. Owners should contact their county trea-

surer's office for more information or to purch-

ase a license.
